Scope of Study

Summary: The second of six province-wide surveys of married women in Taiwan was conducted in 1967 to examine changes since 1965 (see KAP I, ICPSR 6862) regarding knowledge of, attitudes toward, and practice of contraception. Data were again collected regarding family relations, fertility, and family planning, along with family demographics. In addition, detailed information was gathered on each pregnancy and on topics such as the total number of live births, fetal deaths, induced abortions, and sterilization. Demographic information such as age, education, employment, and family history who collected for both husband and wife.

Subject Term(s): abortion, attitudes, beliefs, birth control, cultural traditions, family background, family planning, family relations, fertility, infant mortality, knowledge (awareness), live births, marriage, pregnancy, premarital sex, reproductive history, sexual behavior, women

Geographic Coverage: Asia, Taiwan

Time Period: 1967

Date(s) of Collection: October 1967 - November 1967

Universe: Married women aged 20-44 in nonaboriginal townships in Taiwan.

Data Type: survey data

Data Collection Notes: (1) Data in KAP II may be linked with the data collected in 1970 (KAP III, ICPSR 6864). (2) The codebook and data collection instrument are provided by ICPSR as a Portable Document Format (PDF) file and the frequencies are provided as two PDF files. The PDF file format was developed by Adobe Systems Incorporated and can be accessed using PDF reader software, such as the Adobe Acrobat Reader.
